FINANCIAL REPORT FINANCIAL YEAR 2021/2022

Where did the Town Council's money come from?

Majority of the Town Council's operational income continued to come directly from residents in the form of Service and Conservancy Charges (S&CC).

The Town Council's major source of income for the financial year came from Government Grants totalling at **\$19,066,000**.

An additional **\$8,041,000** came from other income, such as fees charged for maintaining HDB carparks, Temporary Occupation Licences, and use of void decks, etc.

What did the Town Council spend it on?

The Town Council's total expenses and transfers carried out for the year amounted to **\$72,916,000**. The highest disbursement item of the year is Water and Electricity, incurring a total expenditure of **\$8,773,000**. This is followed by Cleaning Works at **\$8,049,000**.

For the Town Council to meet upcoming cyclical maintenance and replacement needs, a total of **\$16,169,000** was transferred to the Sinking Fund, and another sum of **\$16,551,000** was transferred to the Lift Replacement Fund.

A sum of **\$7,365,000** was spent on Lift Works and another **\$5,477,000** and **\$4,198,000** were spent on Redecoration & Repainting and Electrical Rewiring works respectively.

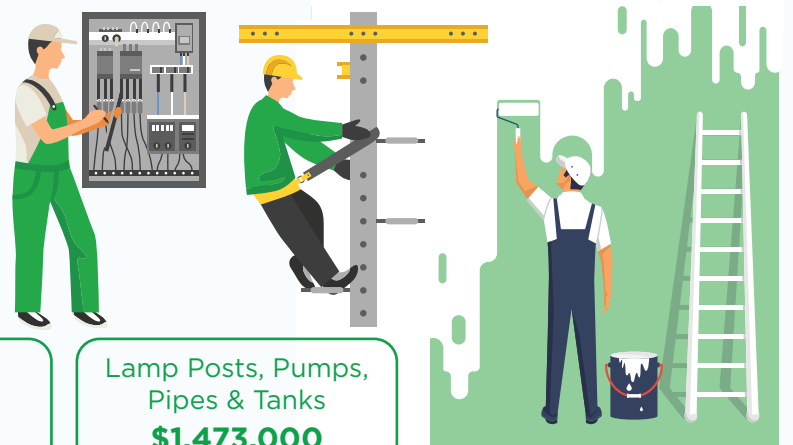

PONGALO PONGAL

Pongal is a harvest festival celebrated by the Tamil community over a four-day period. It is a celebration to thank the Sun, Mother Nature and the various farm animals that help contribute to a bountiful harvest.

Pongal is also the name of the dish made and eaten during this festival. It is a mixture of boiled sweet rice. It is derived from the Tamil word pongu, which means "to boil over".



Day 1: Bhongi Pongal

It is a day where cleaning and discarding of old belongings are carried out to signify a fresh start. New clothes are worn and houses are decorated in the spirit of the festivity.

Day 3: Maatu Pongal

This day is devoted to honour and worship the cattle (Maatu) to remember the work they do – ploughing the land. Cows are bathed and adorned with multi-coloured beads, flower garlands, and bells. In Singapore, thanksgiving prayers would be conducted for the cattle at some dairy farms owned by Indians.

Day 2: Surya Pongal

On this day, the Sun God is honoured. Colourful decorative floor patterns called kolam are drawn at the entrance of one's home, and each household cooks a pot of fresh rice with milk at auspicious timings.

As the milk boils freely over the pot, family members shout out happily "Pongalo Pongal"! After the Pongal is offered to the Sun God, they would feast on several Pongal dishes that are prepared especially for the day.

Day 4: Kaanum Pongal

On this day, importance is given to the community and to strengthen ties. Families gather together to have a sumptuous meal. Younger members seek the blessings of older members of their families. It is also a day for traditional Indian folk dances such as mayilattam and kolattam.

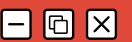
LET'S PLAY AT THE NEW WOODLANDS SPORTS PAVILION!

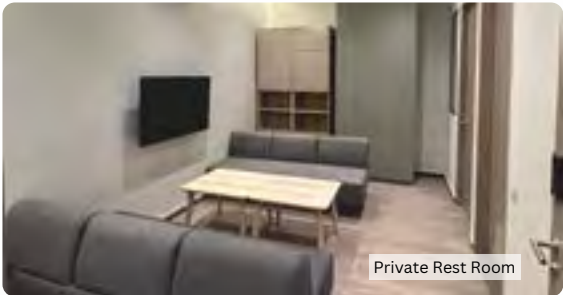

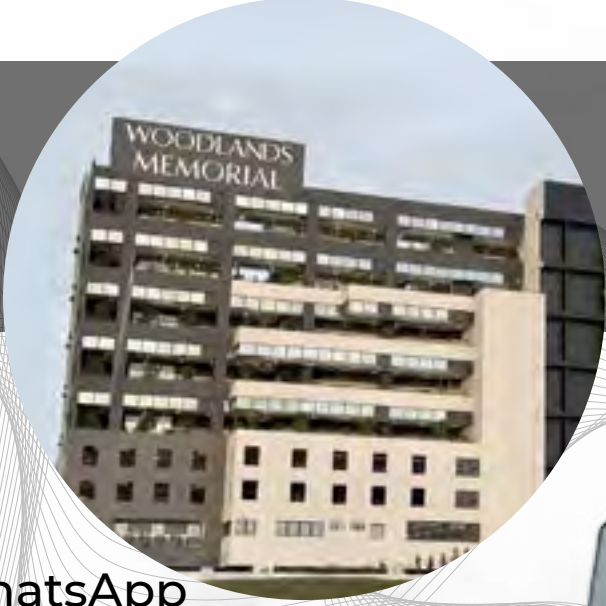
