Volunteers and RN Managers have also been distributing inspect repellents to families in the affected areas. To that, The Town Council has also increased the frequency of thermal fogging in efforts to wipe out the mozzies.

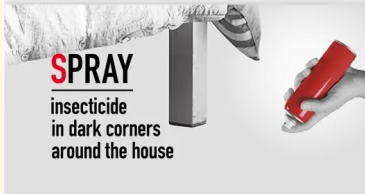

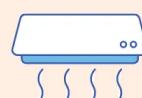
