



Since its opening, it has remained a popular spot for visitors.

The upgrading of Vista Park in Admiralty and the ABC Waters Project in Gambas are two new highlights in the GRC. These additions have been well-received, and are very much enjoyed by our residents. If you have the time, do drop by for a visit.

Another significant event that took place this quarter is the unveiling of the Momentary Monument, which commemorates the historic speech made by the late Mr Lee Kuan Yew on 12 September 1965 at the former site of Sree Narayana Mission (SNM). Although the Mission has since been moved, the spot at which the speech was made is a HDB estate in Sembawang. This gives the sculpture even greater meaning. Do drop by the open space near Block 312 Sembawang Drive to take a look at this new sculpture in our neighbourhood with your family and friends.

I hope you will enjoy these new amenities in our GRC. Go out and have fun at these spots but do take precautions. Practise good personal hygiene by washing your hands regularly and avoid touching your face with your hands. Do see a doctor and stay home if you are feeling unwell.




From MUDFLATS to METROPOLIS NEVER FEAR!



In 1965, founding Prime Minister Mr Lee Kuan Yew made a stirring speech, “Mudflats to Metropolis”, at Sree Narayana Mission, then located near Block 312 Sembawang Drive.

On 16 February 2020, a sculpture inscribed with a key phrase from this speech was unveiled at the same location the late Mr Lee’s words were uttered. Named Momentary Monument, it serves as a reminder for Singaporeans to face adversities with courage as they ride on past successes into a bright future.

MPs for Sembawang GRC Minister Khaw Boon Wan, Minister Ong Ye Kung, Mr Amrin Amin, Mr Vikram Nair and Dr Lim Wee Kiak, PBM, and Vice-Chairman to Sembawang Citizens’ Consultative Committee Ms Poh Li San officiated the unveiling ceremony.

The marker bagged first prize in a competition held by Sembawang Town Council between May and July last year to commemorate the Singapore Bicentennial. Participating teams, consisting students from tertiary institutions, had to design something relevant and realistic for the heartlands.


Mr Ong said: “When we celebrated Singapore’s Bicentennial last year, we wanted to do something to commemorate this special milestone in our nation’s history. What is more fitting than erecting a marker to commemorate this historic and visionary speech made by Mr Lee, right here? A marker that will testify how far we have come as a nation since independence.”

He also rallied residents to “never fear” COVID-19: “We will fight this battle together. Let us all play our part, take personal responsibility, show care to one another and support each other as one strong community.”

Mr Jayadev Unnithan, President of Sree Narayana Mission (Singapore) said: “On behalf of Sree Narayana Mission (Singapore), I am thankful to Minister Ong Ye Kung and the people of Sembawang for taking the initiative to immortalise the ‘Never Fear’ message. Founding Prime Minister Mr Lee Kuan Yew’s speech at the then location of Sree Narayana Mission on 12 September 1965 is a reminder to the present and future generations of Singaporeans that we must unite as One People to overcome adversities and ensure peace, harmony and progress for our society.”



FEATURES OF THE MONUMENT




The sculpture comprises two vertically-dissected, back-to-back human figures. One symbolises reminiscence of our collective past and learning lessons from history, while the other, facing Sembawang Primary School, symbolises looking forward to the future. Looking upwards at the sky, the sculpture aims to inspire the everyday Singaporean within Sembawang's heartlands to dare to dream for and with our young nation. The words "No Fear" are embedded in the sculpture.

The winning team which designed the sculpture comprises students from National University of Singapore, Singapore University of Technology and Design and Singapore Polytechnic. They are Mr Eion Goh, Ms Grace Sim, Ms Gabrielle Wong, Mr Ahmad Nazaruddin bin Abdul Rahim and Mr Matz Goh.

Mr Eion Goh said: "Our team took inspiration from the notion that each generation has a pivotal role to play in inspiring the generations that come after. As such, we wanted to embody this into the site, literally."

RESIDENTS' FEEDBACK SHAPE RENEWED VISTA PARK

There is something for everyone at Vista Park. Opened on 2 February 2020 by MP for Admiralty Mr Vikram Nair and located at 580 Woodlands Drive 16, the newly upgraded park features a jogging track, a petanque court, and fitness corners.

"Vista Park is one of the largest parks in the Admiralty area. The upgrades take into account a lot of residents' feedback while still keeping its spirit, which is a place to bring the community together," Mr Nair said. Pongal and Chinese New Year were also celebrated at the new function hall, marking an auspicious start.

Best of Electronic Games and Aerobic Exercise

Parents who are worried about their children's sedentary lifestyle can find a remedy here - the NEOS 360. This electronic playground is healthy and interactive, engaging children in aerobic activities while providing the same thrill as electronic games.

Multi-functional, Multi-generational Fitness Corners

Mind you, these are not your run-of-the-mill fitness corners; new exercise equipment with progressive exercise regimens ensure you do not overstrain yourself. These corners feature different intensity levels for different fitness levels and instructional videos to help you maximise your workout. You can even charge your phones while exercising!

Unique Playground

Young children will enjoy sliding down the 30 metre winding spiral, roaming around in the PlayCubes, and riding high on the swings at the newly upgraded playground.

Covered Full-Sized Basketball Court

Basketball players can say goodbye to playing in inclement weather as the park features a sheltered full-sized court, which can also be used to host events.

"We have been playing at Vista Park since 2013. Previously, this was quite empty with only a few swings. Now we can have more fun at these playgrounds. I have made many new friends from various ethnic groups here, about 20 of them."

GO ON AN INTERACTIVE JOURNEY WITH TEL 1

Intimate and interactive journeys best describe the experience of commuting on the Thomson-East Coast Line Stage 1 (TEL 1). Besides the regular MRT station fixtures, commuters will find new features that facilitate navigation and elevate passenger service. Passenger service for TEL 1 stations Woodlands North, Woodlands and Woodlands South commenced on 31 January 2020.

The fully underground TEL is Singapore's sixth MRT line. Costing more than \$25 billion to construct, it runs parallel to the North-South Line and the East-West Line so as to ease their heavy commuter loads.

"TEL will provide additional capacity and network resilience. When completed, the TEL will serve up to 1 million daily commuters, and bring the MRT network within 10 minutes' walk of 250,000 households," said Minister for Transport Mr Khaw Boon Wan.

With faster commuting time, those living in the vicinity of these three stations can snooze a little bit more, and have easier access to places such as Republic Polytechnic, Admiralty Park Playground, Christ Church Secondary School, Woodlands Health Campus, BW Monastery and Yusof Ishak Mosque.

NEW TRAINS

Featuring five doors on each side — instead of the usual four on other MRT lines — the new TEL trains will allow quicker boarding and alighting. Condition monitoring devices on these trains help improve reliability and contribute to more efficient operations and maintenance.



ART-IN-TRANSIT PROGRAMME

Local artists involved commuters in the creation of lively artworks through the art-in-transit programme, giving commuters a greater sense of pride and intimacy.



ASSISTED SERVICE KIOSK

A new ticketing machine known as the Assisted Service Kiosk allows a centralised pool of officers to serve commuters at any TEL station via video calls. This is indeed a splendid example of how technology can deliver the human touch!

THE ABCs OF LIVING WITH NATURE



On 23 February 2020, after one and a half years' wait, East Canberra residents finally laid eyes on the revitalised Sungei Simpang Kanan. With shimmering, tranquil waters that reflect the lush greenery along its banks, the upgraded area, now called ABC Waters @ Sungei Simpang Kanan, is a magnificent sight to behold.


MPs for Sembawang GRC Minister Khaw Boon Wan, Minister Ong Ye Kung, Mr Amrin Amin, Mr Vikram Nair and Dr Lim Wee Kiak, PBM, and Vice-Chairman to Sembawang Citizens' Consultative Committee Ms Poh Li San officiated the opening ceremony at the pavilion between Block 115D Canberra Walk and Block 118B Canberra Crescent.

"A few years ago, I was cycling with Minister Khaw along Bukit Canberra, and the whole place was empty. Today, so many young families have moved into this area," Mr Ong recounted. Adding that Canberra East is now served by the new Canberra MRT, he also announced that a new outdoor futsal court, basketball court, three game courts and a barbecue pit will be built near Block 108C Canberra Walk. A groundbreaking ceremony for these new sports facilities was held after the ABC Waters ceremony.



Among the welcome additions at Sungei Simpang Kanan are a communal plaza, rain gardens, new footpaths and a plethora of flowers and plants. Rain gardens serve as natural water filters, cleansing rainwater runoff before it is discharged into Sungei Simpang Kanan, which stretches between Canberra Link and Canberra Street. They also improve water quality and enhance biodiversity. The project was completed as part of Public Utilities Board's Active, Beautiful and Clean (ABC) Waters Programme, which aims to improve connectivity between estates and enhance communal spaces along the canal.

"It's so much greener now, better than when I moved here two years ago. The overall experience is aesthetically pleasing," said Mr James Soh, 30.



SEMBAWANG HOT SPRING PARK

Characterised by a rustic beauty and new, inclusive facilities, the enhanced Sembawang Hot Spring Park opened its doors to the public on 4 January.

Attended by approximately 500 visitors, the event kicked off with Sembawang and Nee Soon GRC MPs planting rambutan and lychee trees and taking a tour of the 1.1 hectare site.



The park's closure from August 2018 to January 2020 was necessary to carry out the first major overhaul of the area surrounding Singapore's first and only hot spring. Although the spring was first discovered in 1908, the land it sits on remained privately owned until 1998. Prior to 2018's overhaul, visitors had only bare metal pipes and a simple concrete floor to use as a water play area. They had to bring their own buckets if they wanted to soak their feet, and would bring their own utensils to cook eggs in the mineral-rich spring water.

Now, the park has a centralised water collection point that is accessible to all visitors, including those with physical disabilities. A new, key attraction of the park is a four-tier cascading pool bordered by stone seats that allow visitors to have a leisurely foot soak in the warm water. An egg-cooking station has also been built.

The hot spring was once a hidden gem serving a small village along 13th Mile Thomson Road in olden Singapore. Its popularity grew over time, only truly booming in the past 20 years or so. What took Singaporeans so long to enjoy this natural wonder? Trace the intriguing century-long history of this unique land.

1908

A municipal ranger finds four hot springs in a pineapple plantation. He covers three, allowing all the water to be channeled into one spring.

Plantation owner Seah Eng Keong starts a business bottling and selling the spring water.

1921

Soft-drink firm F&N acquires the land and business of selling the bottled water.

1920s-1930s

Settlers from the nearby village use the spring water to boil eggs and relieve minor ailments.

1940s-1960s

The Japanese forces build a number of thermal baths so they can relax in the waters. In post-war years, punters take "good luck" baths here before the start of the races.

Use of the spring water for foot spas and cooking of eggs echoes decades-old kampung traditions, which Sembawang GRC MP Minister Ong Ye Kung said characterises Sembawang's unique identity. "What we want to ensure is as we develop, don't forget to 'sayang' Sembawang. It is a place with history, with nature, with its own character," said Mr Ong. "It's through projects like this that we bring out the unique character of Sembawang."



Residents praised the facilities for their uniqueness and convenience.

Mr Edmund Ting, 37, said: "Singapore is a city state, so it is unique to have a hot spring like this. I brought my wife and two children for a family outing today. It's something different."

Ms Irene Yap, 50, commented that the new concrete paths are safer than the dirt roads they replaced. "I suffer from numbness in my legs. My condition has improved significantly ever since I come here for foot baths," she added.



How the park achieves its rustic charm



Upon entering the park from Gambas Avenue, you arrive at a shaded barrier-free path - the floral walk - lined by fruit trees, edible plants and flowers that grew in kampungs.



It leads you to a bridge linking to the main area consisting of an activity lawn, a foot bath and water collection point.



This main area is linked to two naturalised streams whose roughly tumbled rock walls and grassy banks paint a serene arcadian picture.



Shaded rest areas here are tented by foliage, and logs make for a rugged resting place.



1998

Ministry of Defence (MINDEF) acquires the hot spring and its surrounding land for the expansion of Sembawang Air Base. The public asks the government to preserve the hot spring instead.

2002

The spring was closed for two months, during which a cemented walkway, entrance gate, and perimeter fence were built, and drainage pipes installed.

2000s-2010s

The park increases in popularity, attracting an average of 30 visitors a day.

2016

MINDEF announces the return of the land to the state.

2018-2019

The park was closed from August 2018 to December 2019. Toilets, a café, and a central water play area are built to make the hot spring experience more convenient and enjoyable.

2020

The park reopens on 4 January.


Residents tried their hand at carnival games and exciting activities like bungee trampoline. Snowflakes from snow machines lent an exotic "winter" ambience to the event finale.



OVERFLOWING ABUNDANCE and PONGAL CHEER



Even though Singapore is a city state, Pongal, a thanksgiving festival for a bountiful harvest, is still as relevant as it was first celebrated over 1,000 years ago. Throughout Sembawang GRC, Indian residents adorned themselves in sprightly coloured new clothes and turned up in droves to celebrate Pongal and pay respects to the Hindu sun god Surya. Together with MPs, these residents lighted oil lamps - fire and oil being sacred symbols of holiness - to invite positive energy into their lives. *Kolam* floor artwork was spotted, making it a colourful festival.


The name Pongal is derived from the Tamil word *ponga*, which means "overflowing". It also refers to a traditional sweet rice pudding cooked with cow's milk and *jaggery* (raw sugar) in a clay pot and is served to families and friends. As the rice and milk boiled and overflowed out of the pot, residents shouted "Pongalo Pongal" i.e. "may this rice boil over" to bless themselves with abundance, prosperity and good luck.



A Pongal game known as *Uriyadi* was also played. An earthen pot filled with water, ghee, eatables or gifts was hung high, and blindfolded participants took turns to try to hit the pot. The winner is the person who smashes the pot, and therefore lays claim to its contents.

Resident Mr Pavan Kumar, 41, emphasised that it is important for his children to learn about values with a modern spin. "We need to be grateful to Nature and cows; cows help to cultivate the soil so that farmers can grow crops. I tell my children our food comes from the fields, not from the factory or shops. Besides the agricultural aspect, Pongal is also about accepting new things coming into our lives."


Financial Year 2018/2019

Where did the Town Council's money come from?

The majority of the Town Council's operational income continued to come directly from residents in the form of Service and Conservancy Charges (S&CC).

The Town Council's major source of income for the financial year came from Government Grants totalling \$23,922,000.


An additional \$9,525,000 came from other income, such as fees charged for maintaining HDB carparks, Temporary Occupation Licenses, and use of void decks, etc.



What did the Town Council spend it on?


The Town Council's total expenses and transfers carried out for the year amounted to \$92,717,000. The highest disbursement item of the year is water and electricity, incurring a total expenditure of \$12,879,000.

In order for the Town Council to meet upcoming cyclical maintenance and replacement needs, a total of \$18,241,000 was transferred to the Sinking Fund. Another \$27,013,000 was transferred to the Lift Replacement Fund and a total of \$4,708,000 was transferred to the Town Improvement Fund for this financial year.



How much did the Town Council spend on cyclical works?

A total of \$22,404,000 was spent on cyclical works for the financial year, which ended on 31 March 2019. A sum of \$14,823,000 was spent on Lift Works and another \$2,629,000 was spent on Redecoration and Repainting Works.

Offsets & Rebates



- U-Save voucher amount doubled for eligible households

CPF Housing Grant



- Up to \$160,000 for first-time HDB flat buyers
- Higher monthly household income ceiling to qualify for grant

Healthcare Support



- Healthcare subsidies up to 80% at public healthcare institutions and aged care services
- Increased health care and device purchase support via CHAS, Pioneer Generation Package, Merdeka Generation Package, CareShield Life, Long-Term Care Support Fund and Seniors' Mobility and Enabling Fund

Environmental Sustainability



- \$5 billion to protect Singapore against rising sea levels
- SG Eco Fund to support community partnerships on sustainability initiatives
- All HDB towns to be eco-friendly by 2030
- Incentives to encourage buying of energy-efficient appliances
- Increased rebate and better infrastructure to own and accommodate Electric Vehicles
